



Definition of a Reportable Offence

A **Reportable Offence** occurs when a Player or Official is alleged to have committed an offence under **Law 22.2.2** of the **Laws of Australian Football**. While Law 22.2.2 provides a non-exhaustive list, AFL NSW/ACT may classify additional offences under these Rules.

A Reportable Offence may occur:

- During a match
- On the day of the match and within the immediate vicinity of the venue

Types of Reportable Offences

- 1. Low-Level Offence Does not require grading
- 2. Classifiable Offence Requires grading
- 3. **Direct Tribunal Offence** Referred directly to the Tribunal for hearing and determination

Processing Reportable Offences

1. Assessment Process

- Review Umpire Notice of Reports, Club Citing, or Footage Review
- Notify clubs regarding the report and gather information on potential player impact (injury claims, witness statements, footage, medical reports, etc.)
- The AFL NSW/ACT Match Review Panel (MRP) assesses the offence and determines grading as per the National Community Football Policy Handbook (Appendix 1)
- If no offence is deemed to have occurred, the report is dismissed, and clubs are notified

2. Notice of Charge

If a Reportable Offence is confirmed, a **Notice of Charge** is issued to the Reported Person's Club, which includes:

- Description of the incident
- Grading of the offence
- Early Guilty Plea (EGP) offer or Direct Tribunal Referral details

The Club must (within the deadline):

• Communicate the **Notice of Charge** to the Reported Player





• Ensure the player understands their **options**

Responding to a Notice of Charge

- Accept the EGP: The matter is closed, the suspension (if applicable) begins immediately, and the record is updated
- Reject the EGP: The matter is referred to the AFL NSW/ACT Tribunal for further determination

Key Notes

- The **description** in the Notice of Charge is a summary used by the **MRP** for determination
- Only the offence and sanction are recorded on the player's PlayHQ profile
- This information is **not publicly available**
